

A Word from Our Executive Director Wolf Smith

The month of May is mental health awareness month, and it is impossible to

talk about our work without describing the impact on mental well-being. For many of us, conflict is a source of stress, anxiety, frustration and fear. The truth is, our brains cannot differentiate between an emotional threat and a physical one. Biologically speaking, an upset friend or neighbor triggers the same part of the brain as being chased by a wild animal.

That is why we approach every conflict, even ones that may seem trivial to others, with respect and validation. Whether a client is facing the trauma of eviction or feeling unsafe in their own home due to a threatening neighbor, each of these impacts their mental well-being. So, we view each service as an opportunity to help our neighbors de-escalate, reprocess conflict, and decrease stress.

mental health awareness campaign

In the weeks leading up to and during Mental Health Awareness Month, Saint Louis MHB launched a campaign called **Wellness in Neighborhoods (WIN)**. The campaign has three goals: (1) Normalize conversations about mental health and wellbeing by discussing the basics of mental health and self-care; (2) Normalize help seeking behaviors by raising the visibility of our funded partners and discussing the basics of navigating and accessing mental health care; and (3) Identifying community champions interested in building their understanding of what it means to create wellness for individuals, families, and neighborhoods. We are beginning our campaign in the seven Wards listed below this year with a plan to reach the remaining seven in 2025.

Key Features:

- Opportunities for residents and community partners to attend Mental Health First Aid training at no cost and participate in other educational activities centered on understanding mental illness and learning skills that support mental wellness.
- Planning a social or recreational neighborhood event centered on mental wellness.
- Sharing information at the neighborhood level about wellness events and raising public awareness about mental health and how to access mental health services. We hope that together, communities can learn to have constructive, informed, and supportive conversations about what mental health is and isn't and what we can all do to strengthen our mental wellbeing.


